Dear Resident:

Please Note: This flyer covers the entire year of 2012.

Please take the time to read our new Garbage District Flyer. The flyer contains critical information about the services we provide and the schedules for waste collection. In order to provide you with the best possible service, the East Windsor Township Garbage District needs all residents to review this Directory and comply with the regulations and schedules. The Directory will provide you with schedules for the collection of trash, recyclable materials, bulk, white goods, limbs, brush, leaves and grass. Inside the Directory you will find descriptions of each type of refuse, the dates when each is picked up and the instructions for how to prepare each item for pick up.

Please take the time to review the entire Directory. By reading this directory carefully, you can find out how to best utilize our services and obtain the best possible service. By adhering to the schedules provided, residents will avoid refuse remaining at curbside for prolonged periods. This makes our community more attractive, reduces litter, and keeps our streets and sidewalks clear. By placing refuse materials at curbside properly, residents help speed the collection process. This reduces the time refuse is at the curb and reduces man hours expended by the collecting crews. Improper placement of materials at the curb causes delays in completing routes and in certain cases will cause materials not to be picked up.

In order to serve you better, we have a direct phone line specifically dedicated to assisting residents with problems or questions. The number is (609) 371-7152. This number may be called at any time and messages are checked frequently. The best times to call to speak directly with a foreman are Monday through Friday between 7:00 A.M. and 8:00 A.M. and between 2:30 P.M. and 3:30 P.M. At all other times simply leave a voice mail message and we will respond at our first opportunity.

We take great pride in providing a high quality of service to our residents. With your help and cooperation, we will continue to provide the critical solid waste and recycling services you rely on, in a manner that is efficient and cost effective for every resident.

Overview of Services

The garbage district is operated as a division within the Department of Public Works. The division is responsible for the collection of garbage for those residents who are within the district. This includes household garbage, bulk trash, white goods, and all varieties of vegetative waste including wood, brush, vines, leaves and grass. The Department of Public Works also manages the Township's curbside recycling program which is currently contracted to Waste Management and the service is provided to all residents within the garbage district. In addition, the Township operates a recycling facility for drop off of tires, waste oil, car batteries and computers and computer components. This facility is open to all residents of the Township for **residential recycling only**.

While garbage district collection programs are the top priority of the Public Works Department, when emergencies do occur, usually as a result of weather, schedules may be temporarily disrupted. In case of an emergency, Public Works diverts all available resources to resuming collection services at the conclusion of the emergency. Every effort will be made to return to posted schedules as soon as possible. Please remember that sanitation staff and vehicles are a critical component of the Township's snow removal staff and that trash collection will be delayed during any snow storm where plowing is required.

How to Use This Directory

This directory is divided into eight sections related to garbage district services. Each section describes the types of materials that are included in the solid waste category, instructions for their proper placement at curbside, any special information about the category, and a schedule for pickup. The sections are as follows:

In the last pages of the directory is an alphabetical street index. Locating your street in the index will provide you with your household garbage route, specific dates for bulk and white goods collections for your street. It will also provide you with your area number, which is used for determining your wood chipping and leaf collection dates. You will need to know your area number when using the schedules in Section 6 - Leaf Collection and Section 7- Wood Chipping.

Section I. HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE CURBSIDE PICK-UP

Household garbage curbside pick-up is divided into two areas. Each route is picked up twice per week. Area 1 is picked up on Mondays and Thursdays. Area 2 is picked up on Tuesdays and Fridays. The scheduled route and associated days for your street are shown on the Street Index.

Please allow us to remind you of a few regulations on household garbage service:

- ✓ Garbage may not be placed at curbside before 9 P.M. the night before scheduled pickup and must be at curbside by 7 A.M. the day of pickup. Empty cans must be removed from curbside by 9 P.M. on the day of collection.
- ✓ The weight of each trash bag or can may not exceed 50 pounds. Can size is limited to 32 gallons. Please help us in this area. Even regular 32 gallon cans get heavy very quickly depending on density of the contents. Please give us the courtesy of testing the weight of your cans. If it feels too heavy, please use another can or bag! Overweight cans or bags may not be picked up. In such cases, a notice of violation will be left on your can, and the load must be redistributed into containers of less than 50 pounds.
- ✓ Please check the integrity of your cans. Cans with jagged sharp or cut edges, rotted bottoms, no handles are **safety hazards**. Please replace these cans for everyone's safety. For severe cases, a notice of violation will be left on your can, and such a can must be removed from service.

- ✓ Household garbage should contain **trash only**. Please remember our community goals for reducing the amount of solid waste through use of recycling. The cost to taxpayers for recycling is much less than for garbage sent to the landfill. Refer to the recycling section for description of items to recycle and not put in household trash.
- ✓ Please do **not** put out trash or other items in **cardboard boxes**. Cardboard boxes are a recyclable item and cannot be taken with household trash, or used as a container. This will result in the box being left at curbside.
- ✓ **Under no circumstances should household trash contain hazardous waste items**. This will result in your trash container being left curbside and could result in further action.
- ✓ Do not place full or part full paint cans in with your trash. Paint containers leak when compacted and drain onto the ground leaving unsightly residues on our streets.
- ✓ **NEW Since 2011** – Televisions and Computers are no longer allowed to be put out for trash or bulk collections due to changes in State recycling regulations. Computers and computer related devices may be dropped off at the Township’s Public Works Facility on Ward Street on weekdays between 7:30 A.M. and 2:30 P.M. Televisions can be dropped off at Mercer County Electronic Waste Disposal Days. (See Section 8 - Other Services for details).

HOLIDAYS. There is **no trash pick-up on the following Holidays**. If your pick-up day falls on one of these days, your garbage will be picked up on your next regular pickup date.

When garbage collection is disrupted by **emergencies**, leave your trash at the curb. Trash will be collected by additional crews later in the same day or as soon as possible thereafter. Please do not put trash in the street during snow emergencies as it impedes proper plowing and frequently becomes scattered when hit by snow from the plows.

Section 2. - RECYCLING CURBSIDE PICK-UP

*Note: There is no collection on Wednesday July 4th. That collection will be on Saturday, July 7, 2012

Use the street index at the back of this flyer to determine your Area number. You are in Area 1 if your regular trash days are Monday and Thursday, & Area 2 if your regular trash days are Tuesday and Friday.

Recyclables are currently collected by Waste Management Inc. Under a newer system of recycling collection and sorting, recyclables no longer need to be separated. Residents can use green or yellow recycling cans for any eligible recycling materials. This makes the recycling process easier. Below is a list of eligible recyclable materials.

magazines, catalogs and “junk mail”
school, copier and computer paper
dry food boxes (remove liners)

all colors of glass food, beverage jars and bottles

steel/tin bimetal food and beverage cans
decorative steel such as cookie tins/band-aid cans
plastic bottles (#1 or #2 in recycling symbol)
juice drink boxes

DON'T

no waxed papers
no soda or beer boxes or frozen food boxes
no food stained boxes (pizza, etc.)
no oil or antifreeze containers
no paper towels or tissue paper
no fax or carbon paper
no paper plates or styrofoam
no books
no ceramics, dishes, crystal
no milk cartons
no light bulbs, glass, mirrors
no paint cans, pesticide spray cans
no scrap metal, foil or food residue
no plastic film, tubs, bags
no chemical containers

Missed Recycling. Recycling containers, the yellow and green buckets, should be set out curbside for collection on these dates. If your recycling is not collected on the day scheduled, call 609-443-4000 ext. 215 and be sure to provide your street address. When recycling is missed, the missed stops are collected within 24 hours from the time of notification to the contractor. Please do not remove recycling from the curb during that period.

Extra Cans. Additional or replacement recycling containers are available for purchase at Shoprite on Route 130 and at Grooms Lawnmower repair on Ward Street. There is no limit to the number of containers that can be used. Recycling containers come in green and yellow. You may use either color or both colors for all recycling.

Section 3. BULK GOODS CURBSIDE PICK-UP

Bulk material consists of mattresses, furniture, microwaves, stereos, scrap wood, doors, windows (no broken glass allowed), fencing, masonry, non-metal shelving, other large-sized objects or objects too heavy for household trash, small bundled brush (3 feet or shorter, tied in bundles), and bagged leaves or grass.

Bulk goods curbside pick-up is divided into 4 different areas. Pick-up is done on **Wednesdays only**.

- Bulk Wed. #1 is picked up on the first Wednesday of every month.
- Bulk Wed. #2 is picked up on the second Wednesday of every month.
- Bulk Wed. #3 is picked up on the third Wednesday of the month.
- Bulk Wed. #4 is picked up on the fourth Wednesday of the month.

CAUTION: A common error made by residents whose bulk is collected on the 4th Wednesday of each month is to put out their bulk on the last Wednesday of each month. **This is not correct!** Certain months have **five** Wednesdays. **Be sure to put out bulk on the 4th Wednesday.** Months which have five Wednesdays are used for fleet maintenance and no collections are made. **Please refer to the Street Index to find out which Wednesday is your bulk collection day.**

Disposal of bulk waste is a very expensive service provided to residents of the Garbage District. This service is **NOT PROVIDED** to anyone other than those residents. Contractors who remove bulk trash for profit or as a service to their customers may not dispose of such waste by leaving it at curbside. Residents who are contractors may not place any form of solid waste at curbside other than that generated by their personal residence. Every resident of the Garbage District bears the cost of contractors who dump waste in our Township. Residents who observe illegal dumping or "carried in" waste being left at the curb are encouraged to report such activities to the Public Works Department at 609-371-7152.

Please be reminded of some points to assist us in collecting your bulk items:

- ✓ Bulk items may not be placed at curbside before 9 P.M. the night before scheduled pickup and must be at curbside by 7A.M. the day of pickup. Empty containers after pick-up has occurred must be removed from curbside by 9 P.M. the day of collection.
- ✓ Material must be free from sharp jagged edges.
- ✓ Wood must be **free from exposed nails**. Please remove all nails or hammer nails, bending them back into wood piece so that point is not exposed.
- ✓ Bulk materials should be from **residential disposal ONLY!**
- ✓ Bulk items should be limited to two piles no larger than 6' by 4' to ensure completion of pick-up areas for all residents!
- ✓ **SMALL** brush is that which is 3 feet or shorter in length, and less than ½ inch in diameter. Brush **must be tied** in bundles, using twine, strips of rags, or rope. Bundles should be limited to **50 pounds** or lighter. No loose brush will be picked up.
- ✓ During the Spring and Summer, trash collection increases measurably due to yard cleanup, construction and home improvements. Please schedule projects which generate bulk refuse to coincide with your bulk pickup whenever possible.
- ✓ Metal cased appliances are **NOT** bulk. They are white goods collected on the third Wednesday throughout the Township. Any all metal waste should be put out with white goods on the third Wednesday. (See Section #5 – White Goods)
- ✓ **NEW Since 2011 - Televisions and Computers are electronic waste per State law and can no longer be collected with trash or bulk. They must be disposed of separately. (See Section 8 - Other Services)**

Section 4. - GRASS DISPOSAL

One of the most costly items for the Township to dispose of is grass clippings. The tonnage that is land filled each day by the Garbage District and the resulting cost, increases dramatically when grass is added to the solid waste collection. East Windsor encourages every resident to use alternative disposal methods for grass clippings. The alternatives include composting and the use of mulching mowers. In most cases, lawn contractors will remove the clippings if requested.

The East Windsor Township Garbage District does collect grass clippings along with your regular garbage. Please use this method of disposal only as a last resort. If you must put grass clippings at the curb for collection, place the grass clippings in plastic bags or containers that weigh no more than 50 pounds. Your cooperation in packaging your clippings in smaller bags will make collection proceed more efficiently and safely. Bags should be left open and placed on the curb, **not in the street**. Bags of grass left in the street can block heavy summer rains from reaching the storm drains and cause localized flooding of streets.

Section 5. -WHITE GOODS CURBSIDE PICK-UP

White goods curbside pick-up is performed on the **third Wednesday of each month** for the entire Township. There is no need to use the Street Index for White Goods. It is the same day for everyone! White goods consist of stoves, refrigerators, washers, dryers, dishwashers, air conditioners, hot water heaters, other metal jacketed appliances, **entirely** metal cabinets and steel. Computers and Televisions are not white goods.

Be reminded of a few points to assist us in collecting your white goods:

- ✓ White goods items cannot be placed at curbside before 9 P.M. the night before scheduled pickup and must be at curbside by 7A.M. the day of pickup.
- ✓ Material must be free from sharp jagged edges.
- ✓ Goods must be curbside. No collection will be made from any other location on a resident's property.
- ✓ **Doors on appliances must be removed for the safety of our children!**

Section 6. - LEAF COLLECTION PROGRAM

SPECIAL LEAF COLLECTION - MONDAY, APRIL 2, 2012 through FRIDAY, APRIL 6, 2012

NEW - There will be a special one week leaf collection April 2 through April 6. This spring collection will be the **only time** leaves are collected at the curb until next fall. After this collection, leaves must be bagged for pickup. To have leaves picked up during the spring pickup, **place leaves at the curb no later than Sunday, April 1**. Each street will be picked up only once during the five day collection. Leaves out by April 1 will be picked up prior to the end of the week.

Leaves must be separated from all other waste. Please do not mix them with trash or branches. These items must be segregated for scheduled collections. Leaves mixed with branches cannot be picked up with vacuums and mixed piles will not be collected. Please leave several feet between brush and leaf piles if you have both items out for collection. **State storm water regulations prohibit placing any vegetative waste within 10 feet of a storm drain.**

The Township's fall leaf collection program will **begin on Monday, October 1, 2012 and end on Friday, December 28, 2012**. The program plan is divided into Area 1 and Area 2 for scheduled pick-up. Please refer to the street index for the Area to which your particular street is assigned.

FINAL PASS

Additional full passes will be made throughout the Township beginning Monday, December 10 and concluding Thursday December 27 weather permitting. The final passes will cover both areas through Dec. 27 or until the first significant snowfall. In prior years, additional passes were made through both areas due to a very successful program and very cooperative weather conditions. Public Works will strive to continue making extra passes in 2012. **Leaves may not be put out after December 23 to allow crews to finish the final pass by December 30.**

The Township leaf collection program uses "leaf vacuums" pulled by trucks housing large volume boxes for collection. The leaf vacuum will come by each house one time within each scheduled pass. As seen from the above schedule, each Area is scheduled for four passes. **PLEASE be reminded that once the leaf vacuum has passed your house, in order to keep to the schedule the Township cannot accommodate requests for returns until the next scheduled pass.** Cooperation from every resident is essential for the program's success.

Please follow these other guidelines, suggestions and tips to help us provide the best service possible:

- ✓ **Place your leaves in wind-rows (long, narrow, neat piles)** curbside by the starting dates for your Area. This is the preferred way of placing your leaves for collection. Residents may place leaves curbside in open bags, but this is not preferred. Bagged leaves will be collected at the same time and schedule as vacuum collection. No separate collection will be done for bagged leaves.
- ✓ **No twigs, branches, trash, or other debris** are to be in leaf wind-rows. These items **must** be removed from your leaves prior to our vacuum arrival. These materials damage our vacuums creating equipment downtime which hampers our ability to keep to the schedule. If we find these materials in your leaves, your wind-rows will be left and we will not return until the next pass. At the next pass, your wind-rows will still need to be clear of these materials.
- ✓ **Do not park vehicles in front of leaf wind-rows.** If we cannot reach your leaves we cannot vacuum them!
- ✓ If you use a contractor they need to be instructed on these guidelines or to take the leaves with them.
- ✓ Once the **final scheduled pass has been completed** on your street, **residents must bag all remaining leaves** and place them curbside in **open** bags. If you are unsure if the final pass has been completed on your street – please call Public Works at **609-371-7152** for information.

After December 27, 2012 remaining leaves may be bagged and placed at curbside for collection on regular trash days or on your bulk day. Leaves will be collected in this manner throughout the year 2013 until vacuuming resumes.

Section 7. - CURBSIDE WOOD CHIPPING SERVICE

Chipping and yard waste should be placed at curbside on your bulk day. Chipping should be separated from bulk items and recycling. Depending on your street address, that is the first, second, third, or fourth Wednesday of every month. Please refer to the Street Index for your bulk day.

In general, brush for the chipper is collected once per month, although, we attempt to make additional collections as time permits. Brush should be placed at curbside on your bulk day and will be collected by Friday of that week depending on the volume out for that Area. Your bulk Wednesday is the beginning date for your Area, not necessarily the date on which the chipper will be on your street. It may take 2 or 3 days to complete the entire route depending on the volume of chipping for that month. Once the chipper completes operations on your particular street, it will not return until the following month. Therefore, have material curbside **by 7:00 A.M. on the start date for your area.**

Due to the nature of the work and the amount other residents have placed curbside, it is extremely difficult to predict the exact date for your individual street. To determine if the chipper has already been through an Area, residents can call 609-371-7152. Residents who use contractors should schedule them appropriately or require them to remove the material themselves. Only chipping originating from a residence will be collected. Contractors may not deposit waste from another location at the curb.

Be reminded of some points to assist us in providing chipping service:

- ✓ Chipping should be left in **long straight pieces**. There is no maximum length.
- ✓ Chipping should be placed between the sidewalk and curb, **not** on sidewalks or roadways.
- ✓ Chipping should be placed with the **butt (thickest) end to the left** when observed from the road looking toward your home. Piles should be placed with **branches placed parallel** and not tangled in heaps.
- ✓ Vines, briars, thorns and other vegetative waste with stem size less than ½" in diameter or less than 3' in length should be tied and bundled and placed out with household trash. Do not mix any **hazardous vegetation such as poison ivy or fire thorns with your chipping**. These may be bagged as trash.
- ✓ Roots, brush with heavy dirt, stumps, wood over 6" in diameter and sawn wood of any kind are for bulk pick-up. They must be stacked **separate from chipping** and packaged in single pieces cut to weights of under 50 pounds or tied in **bundles of under 50 pounds**.
- ✓ Chipping may not be mixed with any other type of trash, leaves, or bulk.
- ✓ Please **do not block** fire hydrants or sidewalks with chipping materials.
- ✓ Chipping improperly put at curbside or which contains non-chipping items **will not be picked-up**.

Any Township resident interested in obtaining wood chips can call Public Works at 609-371-7152. Chips are delivered within the Township by the **truck load only**. Smaller quantities may be picked up at the Public Works Facility on Ward Street. There is no charge for chips and distribution is made on a first come first serve basis.

***** **RECYCLING SPECIAL EVENTS** *****

In the spring and fall of 2012, Mayor Janice Mironov and Members of Council will hold special Recycling Day Events at the East Windsor Senior Center, located at 40 Lanning Blvd. Free paper shredding services to recycle old personal documents and confidential files securely will be available to East Windsor residents only. No Commercial drop off will be accepted. Items that will be accepted for drop-off are: cell phones, fluorescent bulbs, computers and computer components, printer cartridges (for EWRSD Hightstown High School Music Boosters) and used eyeglasses (for the Lions Club). Trenton Rescue Mission also will be on site to collect usable furniture, clothing, blankets and working household appliances and electronics. Section 8. - OTHER DISPOSAL SERVICES

East Windsor Township provides other disposal services to **residents**. The following items may be dropped off at the Public Works Facility on Ward Street, Monday through Friday between the hours of 7:30 A.M. - 3:00 P.M.

- ✓ Used motor oil. No contaminated oil or other oil by-products can be accepted.
- ✓ Computers and computer components
- ✓ Car Batteries
- ✓ Standard size automobile tires, without rims. Tires may not be dropped off on rims. Tires must be dismounted before drop off. No commercial tires are accepted. Dealers, garages or other businesses may not drop off tires at this site. Tire drop off is for personal disposal by residents only!
- ✓ **NEW** White Goods drop off is available for residents of the Garbage District who do not wish to wait for the third Wednesday of the month for white goods collection. White Goods **drop off** is also available to any Township resident who is not within the Garbage District.

Mercer County Household Hazardous Waste Days are generally held three times per year. Dates are posted on East Windsor's web site and in the Township E-News when the dates are confirmed. The following products are accepted: insect repellents, pesticides/herbicides, weed killers, stains, varnishes, acids, caustics, paint, paint thinner, vehicle batteries, antifreeze, chlordane, pool chemicals, etc. See <http://www.mcia-nj.com/recyclinghazwastedisposal.asp> for information.
