Dear Resident:

**Please take the time to read our 2026 Garbage District Flyer.** The Directory will provide you with schedules for the collection of trash, recyclable materials, bulk, white goods, tree limbs, brush, leaves and grass. Inside the Directory you will find descriptions of each type of refuse, the dates when each is picked up, and the instructions for how to prepare each item for pick up. By reading this directory carefully, you can find out how to best utilize our services and obtain the best possible service.

**Please take the time to review the entire Directory.** In order to provide you with the best possible service, the East Windsor Township Garbage District needs all residents to review this directory and comply with the regulations and schedules. By adhering to the schedules provided, residents will avoid refuse remaining at curbside for prolonged periods. This reduces the time refuse is at the curb and reduces man hours expended by the collecting crews. By placing refuse materials at curbside properly, residents help speed the collection process. This makes our community more attractive, reduces litter, and keeps our streets and sidewalks clear. Improper placement of materials at the curb causes delays in completing routes and in certain cases will cause materials not to be picked up.

We take great pride in providing a high quality of service to our residents. With your help and cooperation, we will continue to provide the critical solid waste and recycling services you rely on, in a manner that is efficient and cost effective for every resident.

## Register for Township E-News

East Windsor Township E-News Updates are generally sent weekly by e-mail, providing information on new businesses and stores,

## Overview of Services

The garbage district is operated as a division within the Department of Public Works. The division is responsible for the collection of garbage for those residents who are within the district. This includes household garbage, bulk trash, white goods, and all varieties of vegetative waste including wood, brush, vines, leaves and grass. The Department of Public Works also manages the Township curbside recycling program which is provided to all residents within the garbage district. In addition, the Township operates a recycling facility for drop off of tires, car batteries, used clothing, televisions, computers, and all other electronics. This facility is open to all residents of the Township for **residential recycling only**.

While garbage district collection programs are the top priority of the Public Works Department, when emergencies do occur, usually as a result of weather, schedules may be temporarily disrupted. In case of an emergency, the Public Works Department diverts all available resources to resuming collection services at the conclusion of the emergency. Every effort will be made to return to posted schedules as soon as possible. Please remember that sanitation staff and vehicles are a critical component of the Township snow removal staff and that trash collection will be delayed during any snow storm where plowing is required. To receive important Township updates during a weather emergency, please sign up for the **East Windsor Township E-News**. Schedule changes will also be posted on the Township website

## How to Use This Directory

This directory is divided into nine sections related to garbage district services. Each section describes the types of materials that are included in the solid waste category, instructions for their proper placement at curbside, any special information about the category, and a schedule for pickup. The sections are as follows:

1. Garbage Collection
2. Recycling Collection
3. Other Recycling Services
4. Bulk Collection
5. Grass Collection
6. White Goods Collection
7. Wood Chipping
8. Leaf Collection
9. Street Index

Section 9, at the end of this directory, is an alphabetical street index which will identify your area number (Either Area 1 or Area 2). This is important for determining your Garbage and Recycling days. You will also need to know your area number for Leaf Collection (Section 8), for Bulk Pickup (Section 4) and for Wood Chipping (Section 7).

## SECTION 1 – HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE

Garbage is collected twice per week. Area 1 is picked up on Mondays and Thursdays. Area 2 is picked up on Tuesdays and Fridays. Please check Section 9, the street index, for your area number.

Please allow us to remind you of a few regulations on household garbage service:

- ✓ **Make sure your garbage is at the curb by 7 am** Garbage may not be placed at the curb before 9 pm. the night before scheduled pickup. Empty cans must be removed from curbside by 9 pm. on the day of collection.
- ✓ **Do not put out trash or other items in cardboard boxes.** Cardboard boxes are a recyclable item and cannot be taken with household trash or used as a container. This will result in the box being left at curbside.
- ✓ **Do not put recyclables in your garbage.** Household garbage should contain **trash only**. The cost to taxpayers for recycling is much less than for garbage sent to the landfill. Refer to the recycling section for a complete list of items that can be recycled.
- ✓ **Make sure your cans are in safe condition.** Cans with jagged sharp or cut edges, rotted bottoms, no handles are **safety hazards**. Please replace these cans for everyone's safety. For severe cases, a notice of violation will be left on your can. Dangerous cans must be removed from service.
- ✓ **The weight of each garbage can or bag may not exceed 50 pounds.** Can size is limited to 50 gallons. Even regular 50-gallon cans get heavy very quickly depending on the contents. Please test the weight of your cans. If it feels too heavy, please use another can or bag! Overweight cans or bags may not be picked up.
- ✓ **Under no circumstances should household trash contain hazardous waste items.** This will result in your trash container being left curbside and could result in further action.
- ✓ **Do not put televisions or computers at the curb.** They will not be collected. State law since 2011 requires that computers and televisions must be recycled. Televisions, computers, and most other electronic devices may be dropped off at the Township Public Works Facility on Ward Street on weekdays between 7 am and 3 pm.

### In Case of a Weather Emergency

When garbage collection is disrupted by **emergencies**, please leave your trash at the curb. Trash will be collected by additional crews later in the same day or as soon as possible thereafter. Please do not put trash in the street during snow emergencies as it impedes proper plowing and frequently becomes scattered when hit by snow from the plows.

**Reminder: Garbage Can Requirements**  
Make sure your garbage can meets the following requirements:  
Cans may not be larger than **50 gallons and may not exceed 50 pounds**

All garbage can lids must be **removeable**

Warning notices for the first and second violations will be given to any residents not following these requirements. If a third violation occurs, the garbage will NOT be picked up and a notice will be left. Once the violation is corrected garbage service will continue.

### Getting Rid of Paint?

- **Latex/Water-Based Paint** can be put in the regular Garbage, **BUT you must dry it out first**. Wet paint containers leak when compacted and leave unsightly residues on our streets.
- Oil-Based Paint and stains are considered Hazardous Waste and can be disposed of at Mercer County Improvement Authority's Hazardous Waste Disposal Days. **HOLIDAYS:** There is **no trash pick-up on the following Holidays**. If your pick-up day falls on one of these days, your garbage will be picked up on your next regular pickup date.

## SECTION 2 – CURBSIDE RECYCLING

Recycling is collected on **every other Wednesday**. **Recycling must be placed out at the curb by 7 am**. See Section 9 to determine your Area number. You are in Area 1 if your regular trash days are Monday and Thursday. You are in Area 2 if your regular trash days are Tuesday and Friday.

### What to Recycle

#### DO

- ✓ Office paper and mixed paper
- ✓ Post cards, manila file folders, window envelopes and fax paper
- ✓ Magazines and newspapers
- ✓ Junk mail and catalogs
- ✓ Mailing tubes
- ✓ Corrugated cardboard (broken down)
- ✓ Shoe and gift boxes
- ✓ Brown paper bags and gift wrap
- ✓ Telephone books and Soft Cover Books
- ✓ Hard Cover Books (hard cover must be removed)
- ✓ All colors of glass food, beverage jars and bottles
- ✓ Aluminum food and beverage cans
- ✓ Milk jugs
- ✓ Plastic bottles (#1, #2 & #5 in the recycling symbol)
- ✓ Juice drink boxes/beverage cartons

#### DON'T

- ∅ No pizza boxes
- ∅ No plastic bags, films
- ∅ No plastics with the #symbols 3, 4, 6, & 7
- ∅ No 3-Ring binders
- ∅ No light bulbs and fluorescent bulbs
- ∅ No aluminum foil and metal baking pans
- ∅ No aerosol cans
- ∅ No cookie tins
- ∅ No carbon and waxed paper
- ∅ No napkins, paper towels, paper plates or tissues
- ∅ No packing paper/tissue and plastic packaging materials
- ∅ No paper lunch bags
- ∅ No plastic utensils
- ∅ No Styrofoam
- ∅ No Coffee K-cups
- ∅ No drinking glasses, ceramics, dishes, crystal
- ∅ No packing peanuts
- ∅ No plastic packaging materials
- ∅ No paint cans, pesticide spray cans
- ∅ No scrap metal, foil or food residue
- ∅ No chemical containers

### Extra Cans

Additional or replacement recycling containers are available for purchase at Home Depot on Route 33. And online at ([www.homedepot.com](http://www.homedepot.com)).

There is no limit to the number of containers that can be used. Recycling containers come in green, blue, and yellow and must be NO larger than 32 gallons. You may use any color bin for ALL recycling. Large cardboard can be placed flattened in a loose pile. Loose paper/newspaper or small cardboard not placed in a recycle bin must be tied in bundles.

### Did you know that you can put all your recyclables in one bucket?

In a Single-Stream recycling system, residents can put all of their recyclables in the same 32 gallon buckets.



### Missed Recycling

If your recycling is not collected on the day scheduled, call (609) 443-4000, ext. 415 and be sure to provide your street address. We will contact the recycling company to collect it within a 48 hour period. Please do not remove your recycling from the curb during that period.

### Plastic Film Recycling

Plastic film can be dropped off at 309 Ward Street-Monday through Friday 7am to 2:30pm. Also, plastic film is collected at our Special Events (see page 4)

### Plastic Film includes:

Produce bags, ice bags, store bags, Ziploc bags, cereal box liners, case overwrap, bread bags, newspaper sleeves, dry cleaning bags, bubble wrap, and plastic e-commerce mailers.

## SECTION 3 – OTHER RECYCLING SERVICES

### Clothing Donation

East Windsor Township has undertaken a clothing donation drive in partnership with the Rescue Mission of Trenton. A clothing donation bin has been placed by the East Windsor Township Senior Center, located at 40 Lanning Boulevard. Residents are asked to drop off items in plastic bags. All clothing donations go directly to the Rescue Mission either to be sold in the Mission Store or given away to needy members of the community.

### Computer and Television Recycling

The East Windsor Electronics Recycling Program provides a convenient and responsible way to recycle computers, computer monitors, laptops, and televisions.



**ALL** Residents can drop off electronic recycling, Monday through Friday from 7:00 am to 2:30 pm, at 309 Ward Street, East Windsor, NJ 08520.

**Individuals are responsible for removing data from hard drives and other storage media before dropping them off.**

### Book Recycling:

Recycle your old and unwanted books at: 309 Ward Street, East Windsor, NJ 08520. Monday through Friday 7am until 2:30pm. Place them into the Bookdrop bin.

### East Windsor Recycling Services

East Windsor Township provides other disposal services to **East Windsor residents**. The following items may be dropped off at the Public Works Facility on Ward Street, Monday through Friday between the hours of 7:00 am. to 2:30 pm.

- ✓ **Electronics** (anything with a plug) and cell phones
- ✓ **Car Batteries**
- ✓ **White Goods** drop off is available, including resident who do not wish to wait for the third Wednesday of the month for white goods collection.
- ✓ **Tires (without the rims on them)**
- ✓ **Plastic Film Recycling** Drop Off Location
- ✓ **Book Recycling- Bookdrop Bins**

### East Windsor Recycling Special Events

In the spring, summer, and fall, Mayor Janice S. Mironov and Members of Council will hold special Recycling Day Events. Free paper shredding services to recycle old personal documents and confidential files securely will be available to **East Windsor residents only**. No Commercial drop offs will be accepted. Items accepted for drop-off are: TV's, cell phones, computers and computer components and printer cartridges and anything with a wire plug. RISE also will be on site to collect gently used clothing, working household appliances and electronics. Recycling dates will be **Saturday, April 11, 2026 from 10am until 1pm, Wednesday, July 15, 2026 from 4:30pm until 7:30pm, and Saturday, September 12, 2025 from 10am until 1pm**. The dates also will be included in the **Township E-News** and posted on the Township website at [www.east-windsor.nj.us](http://www.east-windsor.nj.us). For further information, call (609) 443-4000, ext. 415.

**Mercer County Household Hazardous Waste** days are generally held three times per year. Dates are posted on the East Windsor website at [www.east-windsor.nj.us](http://www.east-windsor.nj.us) and in the Township E-News once the dates are confirmed. The following products are accepted: insect repellents, pesticides/herbicides, weed killers, stains, varnishes, acids, caustics, paint, paint thinner, vehicle batteries, antifreeze, chlordane, pool chemicals, etc. For information, visit [www.mcianj.org](http://www.mcianj.org) or call the County at (609) 278-8086. The following products are accepted: Camera equipment, CPUs, Circuit Boards, Copiers, Electric Wire Fax machines, Keyboards, Mouse, Microwaves, Phones, Printers, Scanners, Stereo Equipment, TVs, & VCRs. ## SECTION 4 – BULK GOODS CURBSIDE PICK-UP

Bulk material consists of mattresses, furniture, scrap wood, doors, windows (no broken glass allowed), fencing, non-metal shelving, other large-sized objects or objects too heavy for household trash, small bundled brush (3 feet or shorter, tied in bundles), and bagged grass.

Bulk goods curbside pick-up is divided into 4 different areas. Pick-up is done on **Wednesdays only**. See Section 9 for your bulk pickup area.

Bulk Wed. 1 is picked up on the first Wednesday of every month.

Bulk Wed. 2 is picked up on the second Wednesday of every month.

Bulk Wed. 3 is picked up on the third Wednesday of the month.

Bulk Wed. 4 is picked up on the fourth Wednesday of the month.

**Please be reminded of some points to assist us in collecting your bulk items:**

- ✓ **Make sure your bulk items are at the curb by 7 am.** Bulk items may not be placed at the curbside before 9 pm the night before scheduled pickup. Empty containers must be removed from curbside by 9 pm on the day of collection.
- ✓ Material must be free from sharp jagged edges.
- ✓ Wood must be **free from exposed nails**. Please remove all nails or hammer nails, bending them back into wood piece so that point is not exposed.
- ✓ Bulk materials should be from **residential disposal ONLY!**
- ✓ Bulk items should be limited to two piles no larger than 6' by 4' to ensure completion of pick-up areas for all residents!
- ✓ During the spring and summer, trash collection increases measurably due to yard cleanup, construction and home improvements. Please schedule projects which generate bulk refuse to coincide with your bulk pickup whenever possible.
- ✓ Metal cased appliances are **NOT** bulk. They are white goods collected on the third Wednesday throughout the Township. Any all-metal waste should be put out with white goods on the third Wednesday. (See Section #5 – White Goods)
- ✓ **Televisions and Computers are electronic waste per State law and can no longer be collected with trash or bulk. They must be recycled.** (See Section 3 - Other Recycling Services).

### CAUTION!

Residents whose bulk is collected on the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of the month should check the calendar carefully since some months have five Wednesdays. **Be sure to put out bulk on the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday.** If a month has five Wednesdays. That fifth Wednesday is used for fleet maintenance. **Please refer to Section 9 to determine which Wednesday is your bulk collection day.**

### Garbage District Residents Only

Disposal of bulk waste is a very expensive service provided to residents of the Garbage District. This service is **NOT PROVIDED** to anyone other than those residents. Contractors who remove bulk trash for profit or as a service to their customers may not dispose of such waste by leaving it at curbside. Residents who are contractors may not place any form of solid waste at curbside other than that generated by their personal residence. Every resident of the Garbage District bears the cost of contractors who dump waste in our Township. Residents who observe illegal dumping or "carried in" waste being left at the curb are encouraged to report such activities to the Public Works Department at (609) 443-4000, ext. 415

## SECTION 5 – GRASS DISPOSAL

One of the costliest items for the Township to dispose of is grass clippings. The tonnage that is land filled each day by the Garbage District and the resulting cost increase dramatically when grass is added to the solid waste collection. East Windsor encourages every resident to use alternative disposal methods for grass clippings. The alternatives include composting and the use of mulching mowers. Landscaping contractors are REQUIRED to take all the bagged grass clippings generated. **The township does not pick up contractor debris.**

While the Garbage District does collect grass clippings along with your regular garbage, **please use this method of disposal only as a last resort.** If you must put grass clippings at the curb for collection, place the grass clippings in plastic bags or containers that weigh no more than 50 pounds. Your cooperation in packaging your clippings in smaller bags will make collection proceed more efficiently and safely. Bags should be left open and placed on the curb, **not in the street.** Bags of grass left in the street can block heavy summer rains from reaching the storm drains and cause localized flooding of streets.

## SECTION 6 – WHITE GOODS CURBSIDE PICK-UP

White goods curbside pick-up is performed on the **third Wednesday of each month for the entire Township**. It is the same day for everyone! White goods consist of stoves, refrigerators, washers, dryers, dishwashers, air conditioners, hot water heaters, other metal jacketed appliances, **entirely** metal cabinets and steel. Computers and Televisions are not white goods.

Be reminded of a few points to assist us in collecting your white goods:

- ✓ White goods items cannot be placed at curbside before 9 pm the night before scheduled pickup and must be at curbside by 7 am the day of pickup.
- ✓ Material must be free from sharp jagged edges.
- ✓ Goods must be curbside. No collection will be made from any other location on a resident's property.
- ✓ **Doors on appliances must be removed for the safety of our children!**

## SECTION 7 – CURBSIDE WOOD CHIPPING SERVICE

**Chipping and yard waste should be placed at curbside on your bulk day. Chipping should be separated from bulk items and recycling.** Refer to Section 9 for your bulk day.

In general, brush for the chipper is collected once per month, although, we attempt to make additional collections as time permits. Brush should be placed at curbside on your bulk day and will be collected by Friday of that week depending on the volume out for that Area. Your bulk Wednesday is the beginning date for your Area, not necessarily the date on which the chipper will be on your street. It may take 2 or 3 days to complete the entire route depending on the volume of chipping for that month. Once the chipper completes operations on your particular street, it will not return until the following month. Therefore, have material curbside **by 7 am on the start date for your area**.

Only residential chipping will be collected. **Residents who use contractors must require their contractors to remove the material themselves. Contractors may not deposit chipping at the curb.**

Due to the nature of the work and the amount other residents have placed curbside, it is extremely difficult to predict the exact date for your individual street. To determine if the chipper has already been through an Area, residents can call (609) 443-4000, Ext. 415.

### Wood Chips Available

Any Township resident interested in obtaining wood chips can call Public Works at (609) 443-4000, Ext. 415. Chips are delivered within the Township by the **truck load only**. There is no charge for chips and distribution is made on a first come first serve basis.

**Be reminded of some points to assist us in providing chipping service:**

- ✓ Chipping may not be mixed with any other type of trash, leaves, or bulk. **Do not mix in leaves.**
- ✓ Chipping improperly put at curbside or which contains non-chipping items **will not be picked-up.**
- ✓ **Do not block** fire hydrants or sidewalks with chipping materials.
- ✓ Chipping should be left in **long straight pieces**. There is no maximum length.
- ✓ Chipping should be placed between the sidewalk and curb, **not** on sidewalks or roadways.
- ✓ Chipping should be placed with the **butt (thickest) end to the left** when observed from the road looking toward your home. Piles should be placed with **branches placed parallel** and not tangled in heaps.
- ✓ Vines, briars, thorns and other vegetative waste with stem size less than 2" in diameter or less than 3' in length should be tied and bundled and placed out with household trash. Do not mix any **hazardous vegetation such as poison ivy or fire thorns with your chipping**. These may be bagged as trash.
- ✓ Roots, brush with heavy dirt, stumps, wood over 6" in diameter and sawn wood of any kind are for bulk pick-up. They must be stacked **separate from chipping** and packaged in single pieces cut to weights of under 50 pounds or tied in **bundles of under 50 pounds**.

## SECTION 8 – LEAF COLLECTION PROGRAM

The Township fall leaf collection program will **begin on Monday, September 28, 2026** and **end on Friday, December 11, 2026**. The program plan is divided into Area 1 and Area 2 for scheduled pick-up. Please refer Section 9 for your Area.

### PASS #1

### FINAL PASS

Additional full passes will be made throughout the Township beginning Monday, November 23<sup>rd</sup> and concluding Friday, December 11<sup>th</sup>, weather permitting. The final passes will cover both areas through December 11<sup>th</sup> or until the first significant snowfall. Leaves MAY NOT be put out after Tuesday, December 8<sup>th</sup>, 2026 to allow crews to finish the final pass by Friday, December 12<sup>th</sup>, 2026.

The Township leaf collection program uses leaf vacuums pulled by trucks housing large volume boxes for collection. The leaf vacuum will come by each house one time within each scheduled pass. As seen from the above schedule, each Area is scheduled for four passes. **PLEASE be reminded that once the leaf vacuum has passed your house, in order to keep to the schedule, the Township cannot accommodate requests for returns until the next scheduled pass.** Cooperation from every resident is essential for the program's success.

Please follow these other guidelines, suggestions and tips to help us provide the best service possible:

- ✓ **Place your leaves in wind-rows (long, narrow, neat piles)** curbside by the starting dates for your area. This is the preferred way of placing your leaves for collection. Residents may place leaves curbside in open bags, but this is not preferred. Bagged leaves will be collected at the same time and schedule as vacuum collection. No separate collection will be done for bagged leaves.
- ✓ **No twigs, branches, trash, or other debris** are to be in leaf wind-rows. These items **must** be removed from your leaves prior to our vacuum arrival. These materials damage our vacuums creating equipment downtime which hampers our ability to keep to the schedule. If we find these materials in your leaves, your wind-rows will be left and we will not return until the next pass. At the next pass, your wind-rows will still need to be clear of these materials.
- ✓ **Do not park vehicles in front of leaf wind-rows.** If we cannot reach your leaves, we cannot vacuum them!
- ✓ If you use a contractor they need to be instructed on these guidelines or to take the leaves with them.
- ✓ **Do not bag your leaves for regular garbage.** This is prohibited by the State Department of Environmental Protection.

### SPECIAL LEAF COLLECTION MONDAY, MARCH 30, 2026 through FRIDAY, APRIL 3, 2026

There will be a special one-week leaf collection March 30<sup>th</sup> through April 3<sup>rd</sup>. This spring collection will be the **only time** leaves are collected at the curb until the fall. To have leaves picked up during the spring pickup, **place leaves at the curb no later than Sunday, March 29, 2026**. Each street will be picked up only once during the five day collection. Leaves out by March 29<sup>th</sup> will be picked up prior to the end of the week. Leaves must be separated from all other waste. Please do not mix them with trash or branches, which must be separated for other scheduled collections. Leaves mixed with branches cannot be picked up with vacuums and mixed piles will not be collected. Leave several feet between brush and leaf piles if you have both items out for collection. **State storm water regulations prohibit placing any vegetative waste within 10 feet of a storm drain.**
